We are always worried about the club membership and thanks to the web because we had earlier renewals this year and more members using PayPal .

I personally organized many walks in Montreal parks and that helped to bring new members in the club. What a fun way to share our passion to the breed when we can gather some puppy buyers and shar-pei owners together, walk with the dogs and play with them.

# Wrinklegram health matters!

## Body Temperature for Dogs

The normal body temperature for dogs ranges between 99.5 degrees and 102.5 degrees F. Like humans, dogs need to keep their body temperature as close to normal as possible. Learn to check your dog's temperature if possible when you have concerns and contact your veterinarian if you find any problems.

If you're uncertain you can handle the following procedure, see your veterinarian. But it is possible for the owner to take a pet's temperature depending upon the disposition of the pet.

### Taking your dog's temperature:

- \* *Have someone assist you by holding the back end of the pet.*
- \* *Use a rectal thermometer; an oral thermometer should never be used to get a rectal temperature.*
- \* *First shake the thermometer thoroughly until the column of mercury is about 96 degrees.*
- \* *Lubricate the thermometer with petroleum jelly or mineral oil.*
- \* *Grasp the pet's tail and lift it.*
- \* *With a gentle, twisting motion insert the thermometer until half its length is in the rectum.*
- \* *Retain your grip on the thermometer and tail for at least three minutes.*
- \* *Remove the thermometer and read the mercury level.*
- \* *If the pet's temperature is above 103 degrees F. (which is considered to be a fever) or below 99 degrees F. consult your veterinarian.*

## Home Safety

To a curious and creative dog, anything can be a potential toy, treat or prize. But there are many things in the home that can be harmful to your pet. Learning to identify and remove those things from your dog's reach is an important part of creating a safe home for your dog.

**Potential Hazard – Cleaners:** Includes household cleaners, bleach, detergents, dryer sheets, soap and more. All of these can have varying levels of toxicity or may burn if touched or consumed.

**What You Can Do:** Keep all cleaners sealed in their bottles. Store the bottles out of reach or in a latched cabinet. Remember, some dogs can open normal cabinets.

**Potential Hazard – Chemicals:** Includes automotive fluids, ESPECIALLY antifreeze (which is highly toxic yet very sweet), fertilizers, weed killers, moth balls, oven cleaners and more. These are often extremely toxic.

**What You Can Do:** Keep any household or automotive chemicals locked away in cabinets or storage areas. If these chemicals are in the garage, don't leave your dog in the garage unsupervised.

**Potential Hazard - Foil, Plastic Wrap and Insulation:** Materials like these often have tempting food particles or grease on them, but shred quickly and are easily swallowed. Any of these materials can cause serious internal problems, especially insulation, which is often made with fiberglass.

**What You Can Do:** Don't leave foil, wrap, insulation or similar materials lying around the house. If you use foil or wrap in the kitchen, throw it away someplace your dog cannot reach. If installing insulation or doing construction, clean up all scraps.

**Potential Hazard - Pest Control:** Bug traps, rodent traps, foggers, insecticides – even your dog's own flea medicine. All of these are designed to kill or trap, and can cause harm to your dog. Insect traps are often sweet, which is an extra temptation.

**What You Can Do:** Store these items in a locked or latched cabinet. If you have to leave insect traps out, make sure they're in places your dog can't get at them.

**Potential Hazard – Drugs:** Whether over the counter or prescription, or even your dog's own prescriptions, drugs can cause serious problems in the case of an overdose. And don't assume that 'mild' drugs are OK – even aspirin can cause serious problems.

**What You Can Do:** Keep all medications in sealed containers away from your dog's reach. NEVER self-medicate your dog. Only give drugs to your dog as instructed by a veterinarian.

**Potential Hazard – Chocolate:** This sweet treat can be toxic even in relatively small amounts. A half-ounce of baking chocolate or less per pound of dog can be toxic.

**What You Can Do:** Don't give your dog chocolate. Keep it out of reach, and don't leave it out where your dog can reach it.

**Potential Hazard – Plants:** Many household plants are bad for dogs and can cause problems ranging from stomach upsets to much more serious consequences. For a list, see our information on [Poisonous Plants](#).

**What You Can Do:** Review the list of poisonous plants and make sure none of those plants are in places where your dog can reach them. Supervise your dog when you introduce a new plant to make sure your dog isn't tempted to take a bite.

**Potential Hazard – Wires:** While they seem like fun toys, wires that carry a current can electrocute a dog if chewed. Even non-connected wires are troublesome – if swallowed, they can cause internal damage.

**What You Can Do:** Keep cords for lamps and other devices as short as possible. If you have to use extension cords, tack them to the baseboard so they're harder to chew.

**Potential Hazard - Sharp Objects:** Knives, forks, paper clips and sharp bits of plastic are among the hazards often found in the house. They can be swallowed and cause unseen harm, or a romping dog could suffer cuts or punctures.

**What You Can Do:** Keep these items away from your dog. If you see your dog chewing such an item, get it out of his mouth immediately.

**Potential Hazard - Universal Dangers:** There are, of course, many other dangers that apply to humans as well as dogs. Falls, carbon monoxide poisoning, lead paint – if it can harm a person, it most likely can harm a dog.

**What You Can Do:** Keep your house as safe as you would for a child. And remember – dogs won't grow up and learn not to do certain things. Keeping a safe home is a lifelong commitment.

## Watch out for fleas while vacationing with pets!

The winter holiday season is a perfect time to take the family out of town on a vacation, either to visit family or to enjoy a new holiday destination. And since many families would not leave home without the beloved family pet, more family dogs are being taken on vacation.

While it may be cold in Canada during the winter months, many holiday destinations are warm, and families should consider some of the pet pests we don't worry about in Canada until the spring.

Whenever and wherever the weather is warm, fleas can become a problem. That's why prevention should start before you leave on your trip. As soon as the temperature rises, fleas begin hatching, biting and laying thousands of eggs.

When on vacation with your pet in a warm location, your pet starts going outside more often - visiting the park and going on long walks. This is a good time to use a flea product before you see fleas.

Did you know that each female flea can lay about 2,000 eggs in her lifetime? Just imagine how many eggs that is, if fleas go unnoticed for a few days or even months!

Pets are very important members of the family, and taking care of them when at home and when on vacation is vital.

### *BREED STANDARD*

**ORIGIN and PURPOSE** — It is generally accepted that the Chinese Shar-Pei originated during the Han Dynasty (202 BC-220 AD) in the village of Dah-Let near the South China Sea. These dogs were all-purpose working dogs to guard the family, farms and temples.

**GENERAL APPEARANCE**— An alert, dignified, active, compact dog of medium size and substance, square in profile, close-coupled, the well proportional head slightly but not overly large for the body. The short harsh coat, the loose skin covering the head and body, the small ears, the “hippopotamus” muzzle shape and the high set tail impart to the Shar-Pei a unique look peculiar to him alone. The loose skin and wrinkles covering the head, neck and body are superabundant in puppies but these features may be limited to the head, neck and withers in the adult.

**SIZE, PROPORTION, SUBSTANCE** — The preferred height is 18 to 20 inches (45-50 cm) at the withers. The preferred weight is 40 to 55 pounds (18-25 kilo). The dog is usually larger and more square bodied than the bitch but both appear well proportioned. Proportion: The height of the Shar-Pei from the ground to the withers is approximately equal to the length from the point of breastbone to the point of rump.

**HEAD** — Large, slightly but not overly, proudly carried and covered with profuse wrinkles on the forehead continuing into side wrinkles framing the face. Eyes dark, small, almond-shaped and sunken, displaying a scowling expression. In the dilute colored dogs the eye color may be lighter. Ears extremely small rather thick, equilateral triangles in shape, slightly rounded at the tips, edges of the ear may curl. Ears lie flat against the head, are set wide apart and forward on the skull, pointing toward the eyes. The ears have the ability to move. Pricked ears are a disqualification. Skull flat and broad, the stop moderately

defined. Muzzle. One of the distinctive features of the breed. It is broad and full with no suggestion of snipiness. The length from nose to stop is approximately the same as from stop to occiput. Nose large and wide and darkly pigmented, preferably black but any color nose conforming to the general coat color of the dog is acceptable. In dilute colors, the preferred nose is self-colored. Darkly pigmented cream Shar-Pei may have some light pigment either in the center of their noses or on their entire nose. The lips and top of the muzzle are well padded and may cause a slight bulge at the base of the nose. Tongue, Roof of Mouth, Gums and Flews. Solid bluish-black is preferred in all coat colors except in dilute colors, which have a solid lavender pigmentation. A spotted tongue is a major fault. A solid pink tongue is a disqualification. (Tongue colors may lighten due to heat stress; care must be taken not to confuse dilute pigmentation with a pink tongue.) Teeth strong, meeting in a scissors bite. Deviation from a scissors bite is a major fault.

**NECK, TOPLINE, BODY** — Neck medium length, full and set well into the shoulders. There are moderate to heavy folds of loose skin and abundant dewlap about the neck and throat. The topline dips slightly behind the withers, slightly rising over the short, broad loin. Chest broad and deep with the brisket extending to the elbow and rising slightly under the loin. Back short and close-coupled. Croup flat, with the base of the tail set extremely high, clearly exposing an uptilted anus. The high set tail is a characteristic feature of the Shar-Pei. The tail is thick and round at the base, tapering to a fine point and curling over to either side of the back. The absence of a complete tail is a disqualification.

**FOREQUARTERS**—Shoulders: Muscular, well laid back and sloping. Forelegs: When viewed from the front, straight, moderately spaced, with elbows close to the body. When Breed Standard viewed from the side, the forelegs are straight, the pasterns are strong and flexible. The bone is substantial but never heavy and is of moderate length. Removal of front dewclaws is optional. Feet. Moderate in size, compact and firmly set, not splayed.

**HINDQUARTERS**—Muscular, strong, and moderately angulated. The metatarsi (hocks) are short, perpendicular to the ground and parallel to each other when viewed from the rear. Hind dewclaws must be removed. Feet as in front.

**COAT** — The extremely harsh coat is one of the distinguishing features of the breed. The coat is

absolutely straight and offstanding on the main trunk of the body but generally lies somewhat flatter on the limbs. The coat appears healthy without being shiny or lustrous. Acceptable coat lengths may range from the extremely short "horse coat" up to the "brush coat," not to exceed one inch in length at the withers. A soft coat, a wavy coat, a coat in excess of 1" (2.5cm) in length at the withers or a coat that has been trimmed is a major fault. The Shar-Pei is shown in its natural state.

**COLOR** — Only solid colors are acceptable. A solid colored dog may have shading, primarily darker down the back and on the ears. The shading must be variations of the same body color (except in sables) and may include darker hairs throughout the coat. The following colors are a disqualifying fault: Not a solid color, ie.; Albino; Brindle; Parti-colored (patches); Spotted (including spots, ticked or roaning); Tan-Pointed Patterns (including typical black and tan or saddled patterns).

**GAIT** — the movement of the Shar-Pei is to be judged at a trot. The gait is free and balanced with the feet tending to converge on a center line of gravity when the dog moves at a vigorous trot. The gait combines good forward reach and a strong drive in the hindquarters. Proper movement is essential.

**TEMPERAMENT** — Regal, alert, intelligent, dignified, lordly, scowling, sober and snobbish, essentially independent and somewhat stand-offish with strangers, but extreme in his devotion to his family. The Shar-Pei stands firmly on the ground with a calm, confident stature.

### **MAJOR FAULTS**

1. *Deviation from a scissors bite.*
2. *Spotted tongue.*
3. *A soft coat, a wavy coat, a coat in excess of 1" (2.5cm) in length at the withers or a coat that has been trimmed.*

### **DISQUALIFICATION**

1. *Pricked Ears.*
2. *Solid Pink Tongue.*
3. *Absence of a complete tail.*
4. *Not a solid color, ie.; Albino; Brindle; Parti-colored (patches); Spotted (including spots, ticked or roaning); Tan-Pointed Pattern (including typical black and tan or saddled patterns).*
